6th grade summer reading

On Friday, September 3, each student will write about the books he/she read this summer. Students may use the book and personal notes to write this essay in class. They may not use notes created by someone else or generated notes (such as *Cliff* or *Spark Notes*).

For the two required books: Write a one page book review of the book answering the following questions:

What did you like best about the book? Was there anything you didn't like?

What questions do you have about the book?

Would you recommend this book to a friend? Why or why not?

For the one choice book:

Please write short answers to explain the following:

- 1) Write a brief (1-2 paragraphs) summary of your book. What are the main events?
- 2) Who are the main characters? Write about at least 2 (and no more than 4). Describe the character (appearance, personality, choices, and changes).
- 3) What is the theme or central idea/point of the book?
- 4) Did you like the book? Would you recommend it be on the summer reading list for next year? Why or why not?

For extra credit books: On September 3, come to school with questions used for the choice book **already completed** for 1-2 additional books.
