- How does this ancient text understand the issue of humanity? (Be sure to give evidence/examples from the epic to support your points.) What does the text seem to say about what it means to be "human"?
- To help you answer this question, be sure to read the introduction, as it will also help you to better understand the story.
- This paper will be due on the first full day of class. Failure to submit the paper at this time may result in dismissal from the course.
