Honors (H), Advanced Placement (AP), Dual Credit (DC)

H courses are designed to be taught at an accelerated pace with a more comprehensive score of content. **AP** courses follow the syllabi prescribed by College Board. The content of these courses is commensurate with freshman college-level courses. **DC** courses are college courses taught by CHS faculty who are also adjunct professors within our partnerships with the University of Connecticut, Seton Hall University, and Syracuse University.

Diplomas

To graduate with a **Standard Diploma**, students must earn 25 credits. To graduate with an **Advanced Diploma**, students must successfully complete five humanities courses, four STEM courses, and a total of eleven courses from the Advanced Diploma Course List (ADCL). To graduate with an **Advanced Diploma with Distinction**, students must successfully complete six humanities courses, five STEM courses, and a total of thirteen courses from the ADCL.

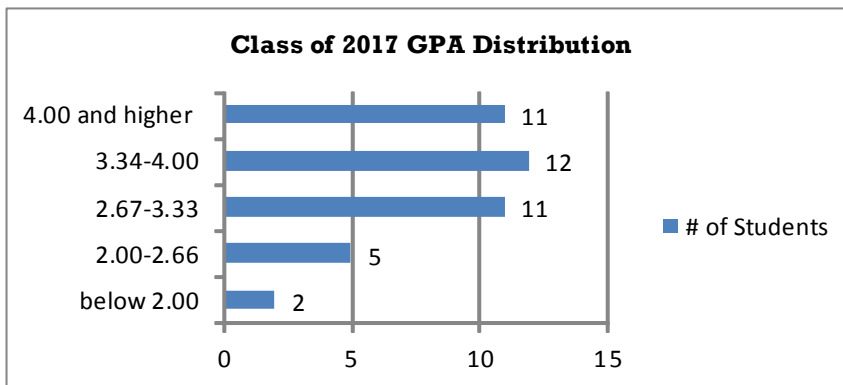
Christian Heritage School is accredited by New England Association of Schools and Colleges (**NEASC**) and is a member of Association of Christian Schools International (**ACSI**).



GPA/Class Rank

The weighting system adds 0.67 to all Honors, Advanced Placement, and Dual Credit courses. The grade point values are multiplied by the course credit to obtain the quality points value for each course. The sum of the quality points divided by the total number of credits attempted determines the student's weighted grade point average. Class rank is not computed nor reported at Christian Heritage School.
